

HUNTING AND FISHING ON INDIAN SPRINGS RANCH

Across the pastures, fields, and meadows of Indian Springs Ranch, no detail has been left to chance. Guided by the expertise of government and private conservationists, biologists and more, Indian Springs Ranch has cleared the Red Cedar, maintained a light to moderate cattle stocking rate and utilized prescribed burning to encourage healthy turf. From deer to quail, and more, hunting opportunities on Indian Springs Ranch abound.

To many who know hunting in the region, Indian Springs Ranch is the finest hunting ranch in all of northwest Oklahoma.

Beginning in 2012, the ranch has utilized a strict deer management program, including enrollment in the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation's Deer Management Assistance Program (DMAP) to encourage a vibrant deer population across the property. Through DMAP, the ranch has been granted, on average, 30 doe permits each year. And with a strategic free-choice protein and corn feeding program, the ranch has established an outstanding deer herd. The results of this meticulous management speak for themselves. Average deer harvested on Indian Springs Ranch range from the mid 130's B&C to 160 B&C. Multiple deer in the 170's B&C have been harvested, as well as a few trophies in the 180's and 190's B&C. The DMAP enrollment is complete through the upcoming hunting season. Buyers may contact the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation for information about reapplying each year.

The quail population on Indian Springs Ranch is equally impressive. On average, hunts over the last several seasons have produced 35 coveys per day, with typical coveys of 15 to 20 birds. On one hunt just last year, more than 60 coveys were encountered. Bird hunting doesn't stop at quail. Free of Red Cedar, roost trees are accessible across the ranch making it a perfect destination for a plentiful number of wild turkeys.

Fishing in the ponds across Indian Springs Ranch is an incredible experience, as well, with balanced stocking of blue gill, redear sunfish, perch, bass, and channel catfish.

If you're interested in hunting and fishing, you don't want to miss this chance to own a piece of Indian Springs Ranch. The deer blinds, stands, corn and protein feeders currently located on each of the 6 auction tracts will convey with the sale of each respective auction tract.
